
PLEASE follow this new guideline – we now have a check out system if you need to collect your children before school finishes in the afternoon, just as we have a check-in system in the morning for students who are late. All parents must come to the office, sign out their child/ren and take little slips to the classroom to give to the teacher so your children will be released. PLEASE knock on the door and wait. The teacher will answer the door. PLEASE do not barge in, disturb the teaching and learning or yell out. PLEASE do not enter classrooms before school has finished and sit down, nor monopolise teachers over five minutes either before or after school.

### A further request –


I am very sad to say that there is a disturbing trend of the incidence of parental/caregivers' rudeness, abuse and lack of respect towards staff which has recently increased markedly. From time to time, we have to remind parents that if staff are abused, there will be an instant complaint laid with police. In this we are also protected by the Education Act. We are very happy to meet with parents to discuss matters in a calm manner and respectfully ask that you take time to calm down before either ringing or confronting us while angry. Please also be aware that there are two sides to every story. In addition, speaking negatively about your children in front of them to staff is also out of order. We promote positive parenting as we do positive teaching and while on school property we will not accept any negative or unacceptable behaviour. Adults are to be good role models for children to follow.

Once again we request, please do not walk through the administration area to drop off or pick up children. The office area is always very busy and this increases congestion. Please walk with them around to their classrooms.
